### DEVELOPING A (CERTIFIED) STANDARD TOOL CALCULATING THE CARBON FOOTPRINT OF DATA CENTERS

During INCOM Exhibition and Conference Track at DTU High Tech Summit in October, several outside INCOM were made aware of INCOM's focus on energy efficiency. Several of these external parties have now contacted INCOM to explore opportunities to develop a standardized tool that can calculate energy and carbon footprints from various services, such as from a specific data center or from a large chemical company's digitalisation. This, along with other expressions of interest before HTS, means that INCOM will explore the opportunities for forming a consortium that can apply for funds to design such a tool. To be continued...

### NEW PROJECT ON ENERGY-EFFICIENT LONG-RANGE MULTI-CORE FIBER COMMUNICATION SYSTEM

Huawei Europe will 100% finance a small research project in collaboration with DTU Fotonik, the High-Speed Optical Communications Group. The focus is on energy-efficient long-range multi-core fiber communication systems with Transatlantic and Transpacific reach as final goals. This is also a general focus area within INCOM's sphere of interest but with specific objectives, that further complements the INCOM work. The collaboration agreement was signed mid-October and the research project will run over 3 years.

### YEAR 1 CONCLUDING AND YEAR 2 START

The Steering Committee adopted at their recent meeting the Year 1 report. This means that the work on the Year 2 plan can commence. The PMO therefore will contact all the task leaders in the near future in order to agree on a Year 2 plan.
